I'm pleased to share Porto Charities' 2024 Annual Report, highlighting a remarkable year of growth in our programs for students and young adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. We are grateful for your commitment to fostering a culture of true belonging for individuals with disabilities in our parishes, schools, communities, and workplaces within the Diocese of Arlington.



Together, we're ensuring access to faith, Catholic education, and meaningful job opportunities. Over the past decade, Porto Charities has provided \$1.5 million in grants to Catholic schools in the Diocese. We've expanded our programs to include teacher scholarships and graduate-level educational opportunities for Catholic school teachers. We are providing resources to religious education programs that prepare children with disabilities to receive the sacraments. And with your support, we are increasing access to fulfilling work and independence for young adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities through our PortoWorks initiative.

As Bishop Michael Burbidge explained it at our 2024 Embrace Gala, "This reality is at the heart of the work of Porto Charities. We recognize, respect, and reaffirm the dignity that belongs to all persons as children of God... We provide grants for Catholic schools and professional development for educators to help them meet the needs of students with disabilities.


Meaningful Employment

Community Engagement





2024 Expenses (Jan. 1, 2024 - Dec. 31, 2024)







 - 1,000+ People engaged at our Gala, Christmas party, golf tournament, conference, PortoPartner events, webinars, and trainings


